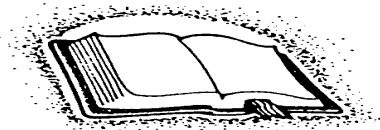

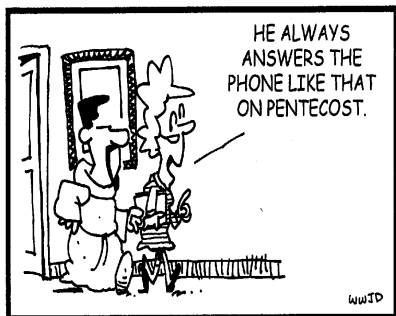

Well, in all honesty, there really is no such thing as "Life Teen" music. The role of any liturgical musician is to draw the congregation into worship and communal prayer. Since the congregation at Life Teen Masses is primarily teens, the type of music that draws this group into prayer tends to be more contemporary, but no less reverent than the beautiful traditional hymns of our faith. The songs, while contemporary, must always be liturgically appropriate and call the entire congregation to prayer

Today we see many of the prominent praise and worship recording artists doing updated arrangements of traditional hymns. Check out the collection "Hymns: Ancient and Modern" for a wonderful sampling!
