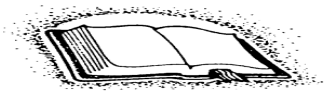

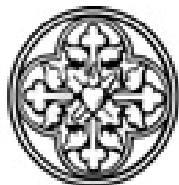

People with special needs and families are encouraged to make use of the additional seating which is much closer to the altar.

CHRIST THE KING



From Father Jason's Desk.....



Happy Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King!

When we think of "kings," "rulers," and "royalty," what images usually come to mind? For me, I usually picture a strong person in authority with a mighty crown adorned with jewels and who sits upon an elaborate throne ordering people around to do his bidding from on high. And this is the picture I think society tends to paint for us too. But, this is not the image that Jesus Christ gives us. Rather, the Son of God, the King of all kings, gives us a very different figure of what a king should look like and be like for that matter.

In our Gospel from Luke today, we are shown that the highest of all kings lowered himself and allowed himself to be crucified upon a cross for the entire world to see. To die is one thing. But, to die in the most humiliating, self-surrendering, and embarrassing fashion is completely different and, not to mention, not something a king should experience. Jesus obviously is no ordinary king.

And that's just it – the Son of God and King of kings is no ordinary king. Rather, Jesus breaks the mold and gives us a new image of what kingship and royalty should look like. Namely, it should portray sacrifice, lowliness, and the willingness to give up our life for another, especially for the salvation of souls. This is what being a king is truly about. Do we have it within us to reflect this image and imitate Christ the King?

This past week, I helped direct the Senior Kairos Retreat for the students at St. Mary Central Catholic. Thirty nine seniors, eight juniors (who applied and were chosen to attend with the intention that they will be the leaders among their classmates for next year's Kairos Retreat), five adult leaders, a Sister of Notre Dame (Sr. Marilyn Marie Ellerbrock) and myself spent three full days in Carey, OH at the Basilica and National Shrine of Our Lady of Consolation. Make sure you ask our seniors how they enjoyed the retreat and how they feel they've grown in their faith-life.

No Religious Education or Good Shepherd Classes on Weds. Nov. 24th, or Sunday, Nov. 28th.

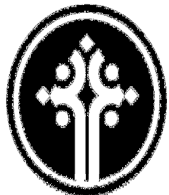
